Theme

Original submissions should be inspired by the artist of the chosen category. Students are encouraged to do research on the artist's life, works, and creative mindset in order to draw inspiration to create their own work. Participants can explore specific works by the artist, the artist's unique style or philosophy, the historical and cultural context in which the artist created their works, and more. This research will allow participants to create their own original artwork that will either align with or challenge the artist's signature style.

Eligibility

- **1.** Full-time students
- **2.** Minimum 2.0 GPA (undergraduate), 3.0 GPA (graduate)
- **3.** Enrolled in the 2025-26 academic year (undergraduate: current rising sophomores/juniors/seniors, graduate: current first-year)

Rules for **Submission**

- 1. All submissions will be judged based on originality (unique and personal expression), engagement with the theme, and technical skill.
- 2. All pieces must be original works created specifically for this competition.
- **3.** The use of AI tools and software is not permitted.
- **4.** Participation in the competition includes the consent for submissions to be publicized in the Highlander Magazine, as well as various AUA publications.

Submission Guidelines

Best Writer

Paruyr Sevak prize

Writing Style:

Narrative nonfiction or fiction writing only (no poems or hybrid genres)

Nonfiction could include:

Feature articles in journalistic style that research and explore the theme in some way or that take a unique angle or perspective on the theme

Essays (personal, memoir, etc.) that connect to the theme in a relevant way, either topically or stylistically

Fiction could include:

• Short stories that fit with the theme in a relevant way, either topically or stylistically

Word Count: 800-1,500 words

Format/File Naming: PDF document FullName_WorkTitle_Category

Best Photographer

Yousuf Karsh prize

Photo series: 6 -15 photos

Submit a short caption for each photograph describing the content of each image, typically including who, what, where, and when. The captions must be in the same file as your Project Description (PDF).

File Size/Format: JPG format. No smaller than 2,000 pixels (long side)

File Naming: Rename files with your name and a sequential number for viewing order. Example: JohnSmitho1, JohnSmitho2, JohnSmitho3

Charles Aznavour prize

Music: Original songs or musical compositions

Duration: Up to 5 minutes

Format: Audio recording or a musical score. If the recording contains live performance, the names of the performers must be included in the project description.

File Naming: FullName_WorkTitle_Category



Best Videographer

Sergei Parajanov prize

Video Style: Documentary

File Size/Format:

Uploaded to one of the following platforms – Google Drive (viewing access), YouTube (unlisted or public), Vimeo (password-protected or public link)

The recommended resolution is Full HD (1920x1080) or higher. Preferred file format is MP4

Copyrighted images must be credited at the end of the film with proper text acknowledgment

In case of Armenian dialogues, English subtitles must be included

File Naming: FullName_Category.mp4

Best Design (Illustration/Graphic Design)

Martiros Saryan prize

Visual Arts: Illustration/Graphic Design created either digitally or by hand. Usage of external images should be credited. Project Description should include information of the software/medium used. In case of digital creation, the working file must be available upon request.

Format: PDF

File Naming: FullName_Category

Project Description

All category submissions, with the exception of the writing category, must include a short text (200-400 words) providing insight into the theme, concept, and connection to the artist.

Prize/Award

The winners of each category will receive a \$3,500 (1st place) and a \$2,500 (2nd place) scholarship award, which will partially cover their tuition for the 2025-26 academic year.

* Note: This is not a cash prize. The amount will be exclusively directed toward tuition at AUA
